



Applications are invited for a contribution by NES to NHS Boards for an in-service NHS Healthcare Science Practitioner (AfC band 6 and below) to undertake further development. This competitive bursary support is limited to a maximum of £3000 and is for the financial year 2023-24. Please note this application is for funding for one year only, from the commencement of the agreed award programme in 2023-24. If funding is required for the duration of the postgraduate study, then future years' funding must be re-applied for and is not guaranteed.

CELEBRATING HEALTHCARE SCIENCE WEEK


13TH - 19TH MARCH 2023


HOW CAN YOU GET INVOLVED?

Over the last number of years we have seen our workforce demonstrate significant scientific and leadership skills enabling them to deliver their services in new and innovative ways whilst still maintaining high quality. These awards celebrate those skills and expertise and recognise innovation and transformation within our services, leadership within our workforce, and high quality education and service delivery. It also provides a platform to share best practice throughout our profession. Winners will be announced at an online event to be held Thursday 16th March.

Healthcare Staffing Programme

Thanks to all that attend the Safer Staffing Workshop that attended the NES Event for Healthcare Scientists on 9th February 2023. There was some interactive conversations with strong common themes, such as how to gather workforce and workforce effectively and report in a meaningful way that creates positive outcomes for our professions.

As part of the workshop we reviewed and discussed the Health and Care (Staffing) (Scotland) Act 2019 that aims to ensure appropriate levels of staffing for NHS Scotland and care service providers in order to provide safe and effective care for all patients.
